Cowboys focusing on players on the field entering 2021 season

GRANDFALLS Depth is a valuable asset every football team hopes to have to beginning a new season.

When a team doesn't have as much, that can present a difficult challenge.

That's what the Grandfalls-Royalty football team faces as it prepares for the 2021 season. The Cowboys entered the first week of pre-

season practice with just nine players and a 10th expected to join prior to the team's first game. Even with the low num-

bers, the Cowboys are making the best of the situation by embracing that challenge.

"With this group, I look at as quality over quantity," senior slot back Chris Miller said. "These nine guys that we have on the field right now, I believe in every one of them and I believe that they're going to give 100 percent every day.'

The hope for the Cowboys is that the effort shown will be enough to get them back into the postseason. Grandfalls-Royalty finished 4-6 in 202 and tied for the second and final playoff spot out of District 5-1A Division II.

The Cowboys were on the outside looking in, however, due to a tiebreaker.

The team is also under a new head coach for the second straight season as former Fort Davis coach Brad Repass takes over.

Repass has prior experience as an assistant coach at Grandfalls-Royalty and says that he wants to be a part of building the program back up. "This place has a lot of

tradition and from afar, I didn't really like what I saw happen last year," Repass said. "We're going to see if we can get back to where we need to be."

Repass added that his biggest strength coming into the season is his three seniors that will lead the

Miller is one of those seniors along with lineman and kicker Gavriel Rodriguez and utility Abel

Rodriguez. Gavriel Rodriguez said that the low numbers help bring the team together and understand that everyone needs to do their part to be able to keep

playing.

"We all realize that if one of us gets injured, somebody else is going to have to step up to the plate," he said. "That's something that we have our mind on and as a team, we're focused on doing whatever we need
